We have reviewed the accompanying statement of unaudited financial results of **Omega Interactive Technologies Limited** (‘the Company’) for the quarter ended December 31, 2022 (“the Statement”) attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulations 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (“Listing Regulation”) read with circular (Circular No. CIR/CFD/CMD1/44/2019 dated March 29, 2019) issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33 (8) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulation, 2015, as amended, to the extent applicable.

Deccan Queen and Sinhagad express everyday running late

By Shrikant Khuperkar Due to the daily delay, the Regular passengers of Deccan Queen and Sinhagad express are suffering. Every day thousands of pass holders and passengers are traveling between Pune-Mumbai-Pune by two trains running between Pune and Mumbai-Pune, Sinhagad Express and Deccan Queen, which are the lifeline of Chakarmani. For the past few months, the journey between Pune and Mumbai has been getting delayed by half an hour to an hour every day. Due to this, daily traveling passengers are facing huge delay in reaching work and are facing problems like cutting leave of passengers, cutting salary, meeting memos, getting red marks in service book, dismissal from work. Tired of this, women and men passengers working in many private companies and government employees pass holders have to stay away from their families indefinitely. Due to the daily delay, the employees have to bear huge mental anguish and financial loss. However, it is requested from Mumbai and Pune Division that Sinhagad Express and Deccan Queen Mail Express trains and Pune-Lonavla-Pune local should be run on time from Pune section towards Mumbai. So that pass holder passengers and other passengers can avoid suffering. Dipak Shegar regular pass holder travelling everyday Pune-Mumbai-Pune he said most of the offices have Biometric attendance is mandatory in all private establishments and government offices, and since the Sinhagad Express and Deccan Queen trains running between Pune-Mumbai-Pune are running late every day, the pass holder passengers have to face their superiors and their salaries are being deducted from their salaries. Everyday we can not give reason of train late, Due to this, both Sinhagad Express and Deccan Queen trains must reach Mumbai on time. Evening time Mumbai-Pune Sinhagad express reaching time

Budget - 2023

By Dayananand Nene As the Budget 2023 nears, the salaried class is expecting some major announcements that can reduce their tax burden. The increasing cost of living, rising inflation and the lingering effect of the global pandemic has impacted the middle class and the lower middle class the hardest and savings have taken a hit. Indians are feeling the pinch and putting lesser and lesser amounts in the piggy bank, and this is a huge cause of concern for the Indian economy. We expect the Budget 2023-24 to address this situation by providing some tax relief to the salaried class, bringing down the cost of goods and essential services to control inflation and increasing the limit under Section 80C. We expect the government to increase the tax deduction limit under section 80C which currently stands at Rs. 1,50,000 or carve out a separate exemption category for life insurance premium. Besides, there should be a higher deduction limit for health insurance premium under Section 80D, which is currently limited to ₹75,000. Demands: • Income tax reforms: My basic suggestion was very radical - abolish Income Tax. Knowing it won't be accepted, I suggested: - Budget 2023 should emphasise easing tax compliance and increasing the tax base in India. - Increase the minimum tax slab from 5 lacs to 10 lacs - Increase limits for 80C - Increase the tax rebate under section 87A for a tax-free income of up to Rs 6 lacs. - Increase primary Income tax deduction for housing loan, in case of self-occupied property to Rs. 3L to promote housing and savings. - Encourage a small family of four to get a special rebate. Also, introduce "family" as an IT return type to enable family filing with incentives. - Increase school's fee slab for exemption - Enhance the new tax regime with more favourable tax slabs to pave the way for the sunset of the old tax regime and reduce compliance complexity. Set a date for the end of the old tax regime. • Increase the limit of National Pension System (NPS) for private employees to 14 percent to match with that of government employees. - Re-organisation of GST Slab Rates to promote employment along the lines of raw (lower GST Slab), processed (manufactured), heavily processed, and imported (higher GST Slab).
